



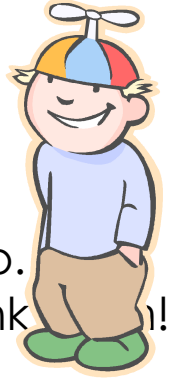

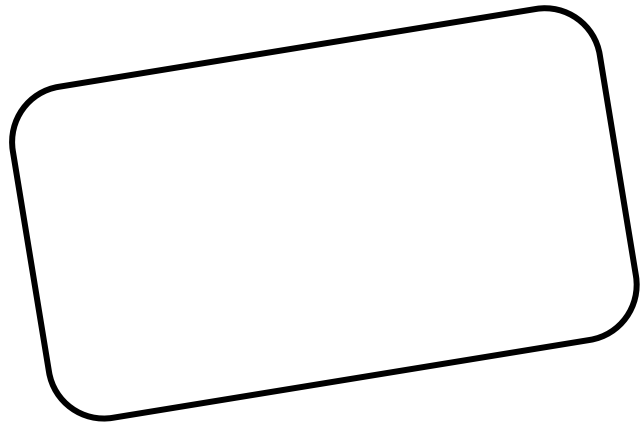

The New Zealand Glow-Worm *Arachnocampa luminosa*

The New Zealand glow-worm is the larva (or maggot) of the glow worm fly. Glow worms love the damp and the dark, and are usually found in caves and old tunnels, and sometimes in the bush, out of the wind.

At the end of the glow-worm is an organ that works like our kidney – and this organ emits light! Light that comes from an animal like this is called BIOLUMINESCENCE.

Glow-worms in the bush only glow at night when it is dark. Glow-worms in caves can have their light on at different times, but it can't be switched off suddenly. If a glow-worm is disturbed, it glides

into a hole which means the light is hidden.

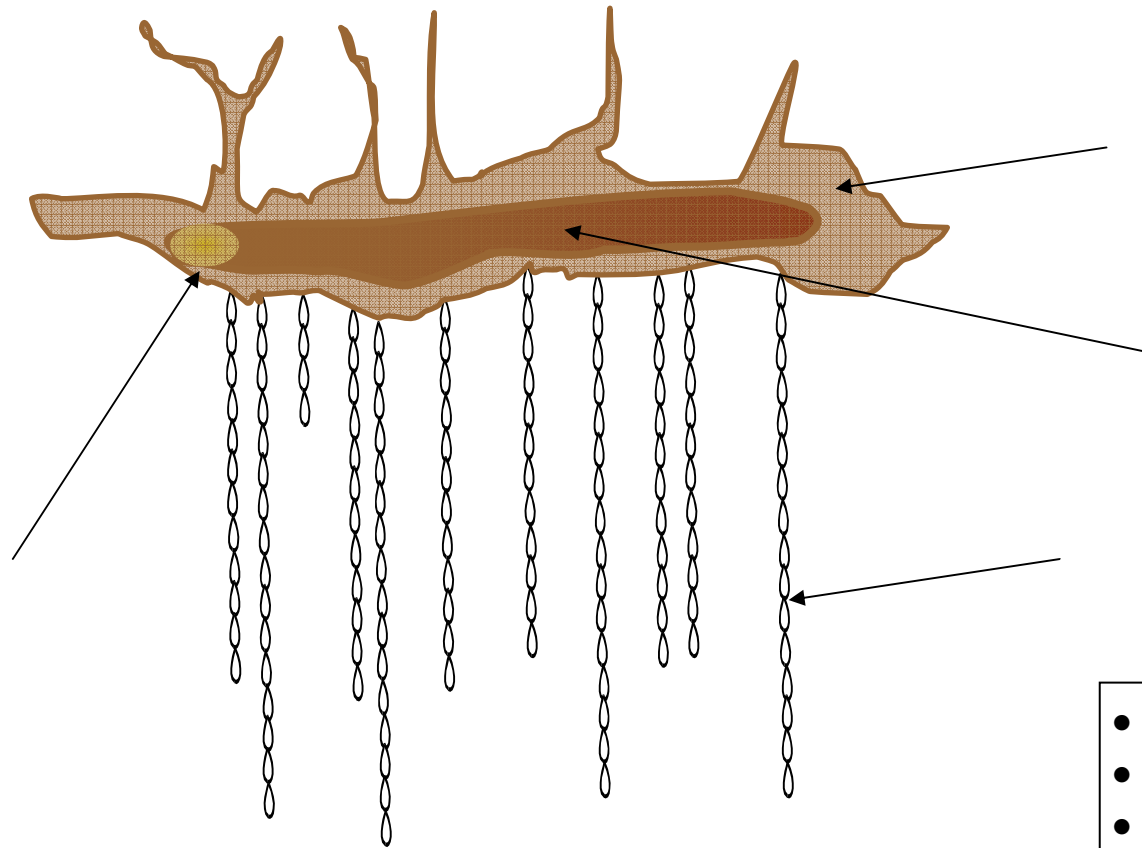
The glow-worm larva catches its prey by making a horizontal tunnel out of mucus that hangs from the roof or underside of a rock that sticks out. The glow-worm then makes long lines of silk with droplets of sticky mucus that hang from its tunnel. They look like long strings of glass beads. The glow-worm uses its special light to attract insects which fly towards it, then are caught in the trap of sticky threads hanging down. The glow-worm pulls the caught insect up, and uses its strong set of jaws to eat its prey.

The glow-worm's main enemy is the long-legged harvestman, related to the spider. It doesn't get caught in

the glow-worm's long threads and eats spiders and glow-worm larva.

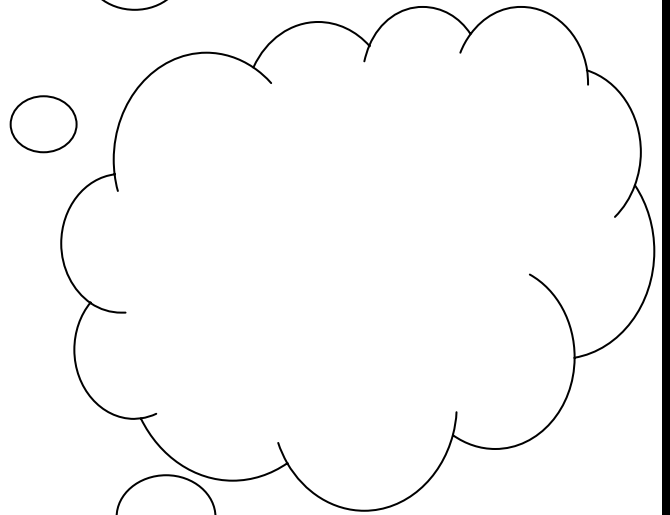
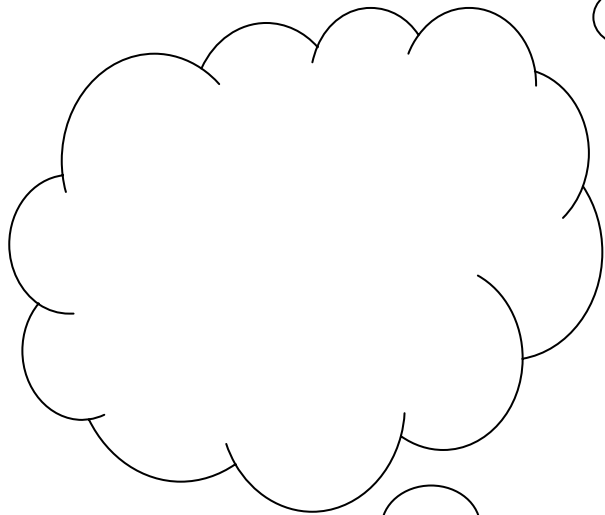
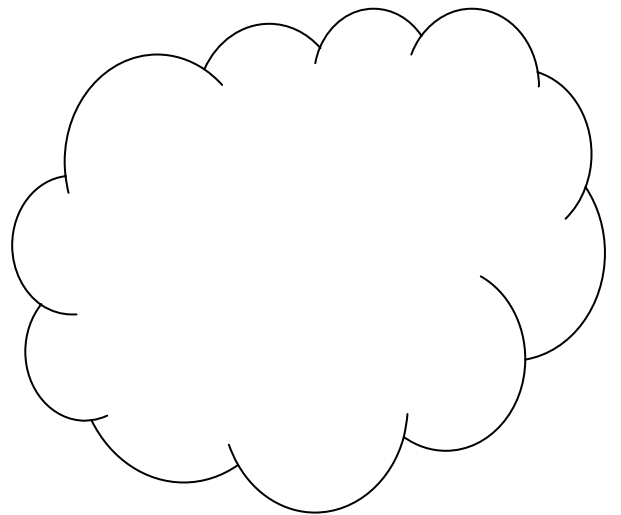
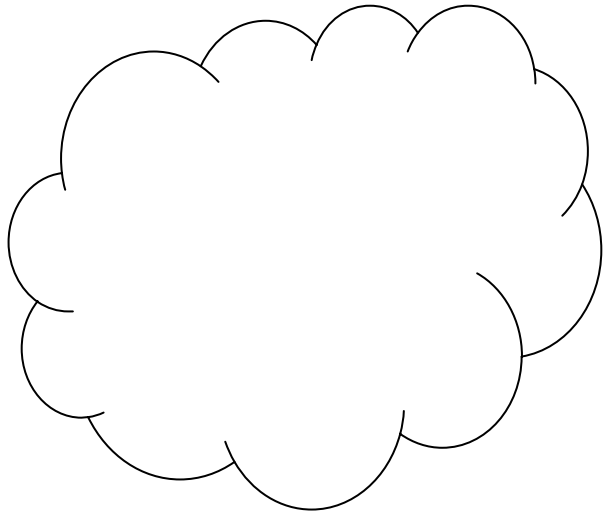
Glow-worms often share caves with the cave weta, which don't seem to eat glow-worms and usually live in other parts of the cave.
