

## When at Camp

- Be with your group at all times, except by permission of camp director.
- Think ahead about and avoid situations that could cause physical or mental harm to a camper.
- Never go off alone with a camper.
- Before you do something, think:
  - Is it safe?
  - Is it fair?
  - Is it something that God would approve of?
- Leaders are not permitted to pursue, initiate or take part in romantic or sexual relationships with other leaders or campers while at camp. This also means no flirting.
- Cellphones need to be handed in
- If you have a vehicle at camp your keys need to be handed in. Take care when driving in and out of camp – no showing off.
- The phone is off limits unless a staff member has given you permission.
- Avoid bringing photo albums, friendship books or diaries where possible.
- Set a positive example in all that you do
- HAVE FUN!!!

## Being a KCC Leader



- You must be a Christian, actively attending a Christian Church or Youth Group on a regular basis.
- All leaders are expected to know and understand the KCC Statement of Faith, to try to live by it, to promote it and to not do/say anything that might contradict the KCC Statements of Faith. This is found in the leaders' manual. Some of what we believe is explained below.
- You must be 14 years or older to begin as a LiT (Leader in Training). Once you are 16 and have satisfactorily completed training, you enter into full leadership, and become directly responsible for the care of campers.
- Senior Leaders are leaders that are reliable and responsible and have shown that they can be trusted; age will not necessarily matter. They will be given extra responsibilities as well as privileges. A higher standard of conduct will be expected of them.
- You must attend at least one Leaders' Training camp per year, but make an effort to attend them all, unless exempted by camp manager (Michael Popping) – this will only be done if the camp manager is convinced that the person applying for exemption has got equivalent training/experience and is aware of KCC policies etc.
- You should read the leaders' manual thoroughly and put it into practice. If there is something you do not understand, ask a Camp Manager or Senior Leader.
- You will be required to consent to having a Police Check performed on you if you are aged 17 or over. If you are under 17 you will be required to sign a statement declaring that you have not been investigated by the police or been under the Youth Justice service.

## Our Foundational Beliefs are:

- That the Bible is the Word of God and is the final authority in all matters (Psalm 119:160)
- That there is one God, made up of the Father, the Son and the Holy Spirit (the Trinity)
- That we are all sinners in need of salvation (Romans 3:23)
- That Jesus suffered, was crucified, died in payment for our sins, was buried and on the third day He rose again in victory (1 Corinthians 15:3-4)
- That Jesus is the only way to God (John 14:6)
- That there is forgiveness of sins (1 John 1:9) and life everlasting (Romans 6:23)

## Getting Ready for

### Packing your bags...



- Think about the clothing you bring to camp. Is it appropriate for a Christian environment, and for the eyes of the campers? Will it cause others to stumble?
- No inappropriate writing on clothing (this includes skulls or gothic symbols, rude or offensive language or symbols)
- Wear modest clothing: (inappropriate clothing includes bikinis, strapless tops, shorts above the knee or anything skimpy that shows cleavage/midriff.) Please do NOT bring these to camp.
- Avoid bringing skirts as they have limitations.
- Guys must wear shirts at all times with the exception of when swimming.
- Camp is not a fashion show. You will get dirty, and your clothes may get wrecked. Don't bring your brand new shoes.
- Leave valuables at home. Camp takes no responsibility for anything that goes missing.

In your quiet times leading up to camp, remember to prepare yourself for your time at camp - please pray for the kids who will be coming, the staff, speakers and other leaders. Remember also to keep praying for those kids with whom you have established relationships after you leave camp.
